Thomas Carroll Delius Concert

Thomas Carroll is the last surviving descendant of Delius who is a professional musician. Born in Swansea, he studied at the Yehudi Menuhin School and with Heinrich Schiff in Austria. An exceptionally gifted cellist he is one of only two artists who auditioned successfully for both Young Concert Artists in London and Young Concert Artists Inc in New York. He has since gone on to give critically acclaimed debut recitals at Wigmore Hall (London), Alice Tully Hall (New York), and in Boston, California, Florida and Washington DC. Tickets £10 / £5 students.

Classical Concert

Stations of the Cross by Iain McKillop

Iain is a painter working mainly in the field of Christian religious art. He also produces paintings of architectural history and related subjects and has exhibited in many cathedrals and churches throughout the country.

Christian Aid's Poverty Over Exhibition

This evocative exhibition is touring cathedrals all over the country to deepen our understanding of the issues behind poverty and how we can overcome them. The centrepiece is a specially commissioned sculpture created by British artist Mel Howse.

Spirituality in Sculpture by Rory Geoghegan

Yorkshire-born Jesuit priest Rory describes his work as “contemporary sacred art”. These impressive pieces are a prayerful meditation on the story of Salvation.

A series of paintings evoking this comment by Vicky Harrison, Collections Manager at York Minster: ‘The work seemed to stir something inside our visitors and many connected with its spirituality, finding peace and comfort within it. Street Action Exhibition

An exhibition by professional photographers of children on the streets of Burundi, South Africa and Kenya. Street Action works in partnership with local organisations to tackle the complex needs of children living on the streets with no parental or adult care.
