*The proceeds of the Cathedral's Lent project will be given to the 'Good Morning, Teacher' appeal. This is campaign by the Diocese of Bradford to raise funds for the capital improvements of community schools in the link Dioceses in Northern Sudan. The campaign has already raised over £30,000 and is looking to raise a similar amount again, to help Church schools in the Sudan Dioceses which we have not yet helped.*
